A BILL

To amend title 38, United States Code, to establish, extend, and improve certain Veterans' Administration health-care programs.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

- 3 That (a) this Act may be cited as the "Veterans' Administra-
- 4 tion Health Care Programs Improvement Act of 1985".

22	SEC. 503. (a)(1) The purpose of this section is to pro-
23	vide a basis for the executive branch and the Congress to
24	evaluate the question of United States Government responsi-
25	bility, and alternative approaches, for providing individuals
26	who, for a period of at least 30 days during the Vietnam era,

were employed in the Republic of Vietnam by (including having served there under the auspices of) voluntary organi- $\mathbf{2}$ zations, determined by the Administrator of Veterans' Affairs, in consultation with the Secretary of Defense, to be 4 organizations which provided significant assistance to the United States Armed Forces in the Republic of Vietnam 6 during the Vietnam era, with Federal and other benefits and services (including, but not limited to, health care and monetary compensation for disabilities which may be related to their experiences during such employment in the Republic of Vietnam), either through the Veterans' Administration or 11 otherwise, and for assisting such individuals in connection 12with disabilities they may have incurred as a result of such employment. 14 15 (2) In order to carry out the purpose stated in paragraph (1), the Administrator, the Secretary of Defense, and the Secretary of Health and Human Services, not later than 180 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, shall submit to the appropriate committees of the Congress a joint report on the question of United States Government responsibility and shall include in such report various alternative approaches (together with comments on the appropriateness 22and the advantages and disadvantages of each) and any rec-24 ommendations by such officials for legislative and adminis-25 trative action with respect thereto, for establishing a program

1	for providing such benefits, services, and assistance to such
2	individuals.
3	· (b) For the purpose of this section—
4	(1) the term "Armed Forces" has the meaning
5	given such term in section 101(10) of title 38, United
6	States Code; and
7	(2) the term "Vietnam era" means the periods de-
8	scribed in section 101(29) (as amended by section
9	201(a) of this Act) of such title.
10	LAND TRANSFER, PHOENIX, ARIZONA
11	SEC. 504. (a) The real property described in subsection
12	(b) and the structures thereon on the date of the enactment of
13	this Act shall be transferred without compensation or reim-
14	bursement from the control and jurisdiction of the General
15	Services Administration to the control and jurisdiction of the
16	Veterans' Administration.
17	(b) The real property referred to in subsection (a) is a
18	tract of land consisting of 3.25 acres, more or less, in Phoe-
19	nix, Arizona, that—
20	(1) was formerly part of the Veterans' Adminis-
21	tration Medical Center, Phoenix, Arizona; and
22	(2) was declared to be excess to the needs of the
23	Veterans' Administration in a report to the General
24	Services Administration dated September 25, 1959.
