#### CHLORACNE TASK FORCE MINUTES

#### April 27, 1983

The second meeting of the reconstituted Chloracne Task Force (CTF) was held in Washington, D. C. on April 27, 1983. Attending were: A. B. Fischmann, M.D., Chairperson; Drs. E. Gomez, J. Graber, J. Strauss, A. Hernandez and visiting guest, Dr. Leonard Milstone representing Dr. Sidney Klaus.

Dr. Edward Gomez moved that the minutes of the December 6, 1982 meeting be approved. The new members were introduced to the CTF members.

Dr. Barclay Shepard, Acting Director Agent Orange Projects Office, discussed the major studies that the VA AOPO is conducting and some of their findings.

Several recommendations were made for the chloracne definition. These will be implemented and forwarded to Dr. Barclay Shepard for his approval.

Recommendations were made that the Dermatology examination form be revised because the present form was too confusing and complex.

A recommendation was made that a special epidermiological group outside of the VA collect and analyze the AO Registry data for all of the VA Medical Centers.

Recommendations were made that Drs. David Taplin or Harvey Blanket would be excellent resources for writing the chapter on the histopathology of chloracne in place of Dr. Suskind.

Dr. James Graham mentioned that AFIP has very few acne cases and no chloracne cases. There is no material on chloracne.

The next Chloracne Task Force meeting will be held before the December Dermatological Conference. Recommendations were made to have the meeting held in Washington, D. C.

# DIAGNOSTIC CRITERIA FOR CHLORACNE 2º 10 ICDD DIOXIN EXPOSURE

CRITERIA FOR DIAGNOSIS OF CHLORACNE: the most sensitive specific marker for diagin logicity

Criteria E through 5 essential for diagnosis

- 1 Exposure to chlorachegens (see list)
- 2 Onset or aggravation of acne within a few weeks to two months, rarely later (average one month after exposure)
- 3 Arme with predominance of open comedomes and characteristic straw-colored cysts (no cysts in mild cases)
- 4 Atypical distribution such as the malar crescent of the face, crow's foot area lateral to eyes and in and behind the ears.
- 5 History of 1 through 4 and scars in distribution of 4 or 4 and 6
- 6 Severe acre with 3 and 4, plus inflammalory lesions, cysts and abscesses, on the face ears, behind ears, neck, back, buttocks, scrotum, outer upper arms and thighs
- 7 Compatible histology: comedones with thickened epithelial lining, few C. acnes, squamous metaplasia of outer root sheaths of hairs and sebaceous glands, minimal or absent sebaceous glands, keratin-filled cysts.

## ACUTE TOXICITY

Onsel preceding or coincident with acne of (1) nausea, vomiting, nose bleed, diarrhea, blood in unine, (2) headache, falique, inritability, insomnia, impotence, loss of libido (defayed onset of these symptoms years later is not an effect of dioxin) (3) lower log pains, numbress

- (4) tingling and/or numbress in fingers and toes
- (5) elevated liver enzymes
- (6) bursitis, edema arms and legs
- (7) weight loss
- (8) triglyceridemia

CHROMEC LOXICITY

- chronic bronchitis, decreased vital capacity
- (2) hypertrichosis on temples, hyperpigmentation of the face, no porphyrins
- (3) porphyria cutanea tarda (PCT) with porphyrins in unine and/or stool
- (4) peripheral neuropathy

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
