ITEM ARSENIC CONTAMINATION OF "AGENT BLUE"	TIPLE INFORMATION REGARDING NATURE AND CONCENTRATION OF CONTAMINANTS, PARTICULARLY INORGANIC ARSENIC COMPOUNDS IN "AGENT BLUE"	PIMARKS AND CLASSIFICATION See below:

REASON FOR REQUEST Vietnam veterans claim to suffer ill effects as a resul of exposure to Agent Blue in Vietnam. Agent Blue was a mixture of cacodylic acid and sodium cacodylate and reportedly was contaminated with trace amounts of inorganic arsenic. Interpretation of the veterans allegations requires further knowledge of the degree of contamination of Agent Blue. If data unavailable, do samples of Agent Blue still exist which could permit retrospective chemical analysis.

If the above information is furnished, I certify that:

- a. The information will not be released or made known in any manner, to any other nation or nations or nationals thereof, without the specific approval of the United States Government.
- b. The authorized representative who signs a receipt for classified material, and the government or nationals represented by that authorized representative, agree to afford the information the same degree of security, or the equivalent thereto by the United States of America.
- c. The information will be used for military purposes, and for no other purposes whatsoever.
- d. Dissemination will be limited to persons who require the information in the performance of their official deties.
- e. The rights of the individual or concern, originating in the development of the information, whether it is patented or not, will be respected and protected in accordance with the patent laws of the country of the originator.
