Title: Agent Orange Seminar to VA Regional Office - Portland, Oregon

Text: On October 24, 1983, Dr. Alvin L. Young presented a seminar on "Scientific Issues and Agent Orange Exposure" at the VA Regional Office, Portland, Oregon. The seminar attended by more than 50 personial representing the VA Regional Office, VAMC and veterans organizations, was at the request of Mr. John Vogel, Regional Director. The topic by Dr. Young focused on the government's research agenda into resolving the health issues associated with veterans exposed to Agent Orange and its toxic dioxin contaminant during the Vietnam Conflict. Dr. Young emphasized that the Veterans Administration in conjunction with other federal agencies has a massive research program underway and that many studies will be reporting results in early 1984.
