BLUE WATER NAVY VETS NEEDS YOUR SUPPORT

Contact your Senator NOW and ask them to please support H.R. 299 Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans Act of 2018

Congress is very close to finally passing Blue Water Navy legislation, but unless the Senate acts in the next two weeks, that effort will fail.

For over a decade, Vietnam Veterans of America has sought legislation to restore presumptive Agent Orange exposure status to members of the Armed Forces, who served in the territorial waters of Vietnam. H.R. 299, the Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans Act of 2018, passed the House by a vote of 382-0 on June 25, 2018.

When the bill is enacted into law, "Blue Water" veterans who served off the coast of Vietnam, veterans who served near the demilitarized zone in Korea, and certain veterans who served in Thailand will again be eligible for compensation for service-connected, disabilities related to their exposure to Agent Orange.

VVA believes Congress should recognize that these veterans were exposed to Agent Orange and should authorize presumptive status for VA disability claims associated with this exposure. Now is the time to contact your Senators to ask them to support this bill.

Take Action enter your zip code, and send the prepared letters to your Senator requesting that Senator Isakson, Chair, Senate Veterans Affair Committee move H.R. 299, the Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans Act of 2018, out of committee and on to the Senate floor for a vote and passage.

These veterans are aging, and the time to help them is now!

Post-9/11 GI Bill Payment Delays Nearly Over, VA Leaders Promise

Blaming old computers and unanticipated software challenges, the Department of Veterans Affairs saw its pending claims inventory from Post-9/11 GI Bill participants peak in mid-September at 207,000, three times higher than normal for the start of a fall semester. 




Know Your Costs Before Making a Choice During TRICARE Open Season

Army Green to Gold Scholarship Program

The 3rd Infantry Division can nominate up to five Soldiers for the 2019-2020 school year, with applications due by March 1, 2019. Once the packets are reviewed and submitted, the cadet command will review them and decide who is awarded scholarships. 

National Family Caregivers Month: How You Can Help

November is National Family Caregivers Month. The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) thanks and celebrates the 5.5 million Americans who provide care to veterans. Of the estimated 2.4 million enrollees (27%) receiving any assistance with daily living activities, most (63%) receive 10 hours or less assistance per week. Caregiving needs for the veteran population are performed by a spouse (59%), adult children (26%), friend or neighbor (20%), sibling (10%), and/or parent (9%). VA Resources to Stop Smoking

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) is helping veterans to quit smoking. Of veterans who have ever smoked who are enrolled in VA health care, 71 percent have successfully quit smoking, showing that quitting is possible. VA health care providers offer a range of cessation resources, including individual counseling, group classes, phone and telehealth clinics, and FDA-approved medications. VA also offers resources such as Quit VET, a toll-free national line; SmokefreeVET, a text messaging service; and Stay Quit Coach, a mobile app specifically designed to help Veterans quit tobacco. We Need Your Help to Finally Pass Blue Water Navy Legislation

Congress is very close to finally passing Blue Water Navy legislation, but unless the Senate acts in the next two weeks, that effort will fail.

Earlier this year, the House of Representatives passed legislation to finally provide full benefits to Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans by a unanimous, bipartisan vote of 382 to 0; however, the bill has been stalled in the Senate since June. With just days remaining in the 115th Congress, we need to get the support of all Senators in order to pass this legislation now.

The best way to send this message is by making a quick phone call to your Senators offices and letting them know that you want the Senate to pass Blue Water Navy Veterans legislation this year. Be sure to give them your name and address and ask that the Senator report back to you what actions they take. If you don't know who your Senators are, you can find a list of them here:

TRICARE Open Season Until December 10

The TRICARE Open Season is happening now. If you want to enroll in or change your TRICARE Prime or TRICARE Select plan for 2019, you have until Dec. 10, 2018 to make an enrollment choice. If you have TRICARE For Life (TFL) or a premium-based plan and want to stay in your current plan, TRICARE Open Season does not apply to you. You will stay in your current plan for 2019 or as long as you are eligible. TRICARE Open Season does not apply to TRICARE For Life or premium based plans. New Veterans Memorial, Museum Opens

The new National Veterans Memorial and Museum in Columbus, Ohio opened recently. The goal of the museum, located in downtown Columbus and designated by Congress as a 'national site,' is to tell veterans' individual stories, as well as focus on their shared experiences throughout history. President Designates Civil War Monument



President Trump has used his executive powers for the first time to designate a national monument, establishing a 380-acre site in Kentucky to

honor African-Americans' role as soldiers during the Civil War. Republicans had pushed for more than a year to establish a national monument at Camp Nelson in Nicholasville, Ky., which served as one of the largest recruitment and training depots for United States Colored Troops. While Kentucky was the last state in the Union to allow the enlistment of African-American men, the camp sent 23,000 of the roughly 180,000 black troops who fought on the Union's side during the Civil War.
