VA works to reduce benzodiazepines prescriptions

VA is working to reduce the number of benzodiazepines (BZDs) prescribed to Veterans in the community, especially seniors aged 65 and older. BZDs are a class of drugs used to treat certain conditions, such as anxiety, with medications like Xanax and Ativan. The risk of these medications for older adults includes falls, confusion, or contributing to lethal overdoses.

This reduction is part of the Psychotropic Drug Safety Initiative, which began in 2013.

Philips Recalls Specific Sleep and Respiratory Care Devices



Philips has released a recall notification for several of their BiLevel PAP and CPAP devices, such as DreamStation. Potential health risks such as headaches, nausea, and cancer have been identified with the polyester-based polyurethane foam that reduces the machines' noise. Philips recommends that patients using BiLevel PAP and CPAP devices

discontinue use and consult their physicians. However, patients using life-sustaining mechanical ventilator devices should not discontinue use without consulting their physicians. Read more.

The screening has also resulted in a cost-saving approach for those diagnosed with cognitive decline. "The new screening has shown to improve patient outcomes without significantly increasing workload," said nurse Jocelyn Almazan. "It has resulted in the decrease in treatment cost for patients."

Know the Warning Signs



Sometimes, a crisis may involve thoughts of suicide. Learn to recognize these warning signs:

- Hopelessness, feeling like there's no way out
- Anxiety, agitation, sleeplessness, or mood swings
- Feeling like there is no reason to live
- Rage or anger
- Engaging in risky activities without thinking
- Increasing alcohol or drug abuse
- Withdrawing from family and friends

The presence of the following signs requires immediate attention:

- Thinking about hurting or killing themselves
- Looking for ways to kill themselves
- Talking about death, dying or suicide
- Self-destructive behavior such as drug abuse



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

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FRA participates in Speaker Pelosi's Veterans Roundtable


DLP John Davis and representatives from several other VSO/MSO associations met with Speaker of the House Nancy Pelosi, and House Veterans Affairs Committee (HVAC) Chairman Mark Takano to discuss various pending legislative issues. This is the first veteran's roundtable with the speaker since November 2019. Davis thanked HVAC Chairman

Takano for passing the Agent Orange Blue Water Navy bill in 2019. Davis noted that FRA supports Rep. Sanford Bishops comprehensive concurrent receipt legislation (H.R.333) and the Major Richard Star Act (H.R.1282, S.344). Davis said that retired pay is for years of arduous military service paid by the Department of Defense while disability pay is for lifelong injury paid by the Department of Veterans Affairs. To reduce retirement, pay because of a disability is an injustice.

The legislators discussed the past accomplishments from the past session. They noted improvements to suicide prevention programs, VA education programs, programs for women veterans (Debra Sampson Act), and sexual assault programs. Speaker Pelosi noted the efforts to get every veteran vaccinated for COVID-19.

There was extensive discussion of the infrastructure needs of the VA. The HVAC Chairman claimed that the VA needs an infrastructure re-capitalization budget of \$100 billion.

The restructuring of the Military Health System (MHS) will make it easier to spread medical innovation across the force and improve care for warfighters, families and retirees.

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HASC-MP Approves FY2022 NDAA

The House Armed Services Military Personnel Subcommittee marked up its portion of the House version of the FY2022 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA-H.R.4350). Key provisions in the subcommittee markup include:

- No new TRICRE fee increases;
- Prohibiting any reduction or realignment of military medical staff at Military Treatment Facilities (MTF);

- Providing an annual active duty pay increase that keeps pace with civilian pay increases (2.7 percent);
- Establishing the Naval Community College as a degree granting institution for enlisted sailors;
- Requiring the Defense Department to pay basic needs allowance to a qualified service member;
- Expanding the in-home childcare pilot program providing financial assistance for in-home childcare;
- Directing DoD to notify survivors of sexual assault about the outcomes of any administrative action taken against their perpetrator; and
- Mandating violations of Civilian Protective Orders are punishable under UCMJ.

The FRA would also like to note that the HASC Readiness Subcommittee markup also contains a provision for DoD to provide a report on Childcare Development Centers (CDC) waiting lists and requires safety inspection for privatized housing and CDCs. The subcommittee markups now go to the full committee for consideration and then will be sent to the full House for further consideration.

The Senate Armed Services Committee approved its version NDAA and sent it to the full Senate earlier. Members can refer to the 7/23/21 NewsBytes for details on that bill. Once both chambers pass their version of the NDAA, a conference committee will be appointed to resolve the differences between the two Defense Authorization bills. The committee will write a final NDAA based on provisions of the two bills. When there is agreement on a final bill, it will be submitted to both the House and Senate for a final vote. If approved by both chambers, it will be sent to the president to be signed into law or be vetoed. The FRA is working to get floor amendments filed on concurrent receipt, and the "Military Retiree Survivor Comfort"

Act" (H.R.2214, S.1669). Members should go to the Action Center (www.fra.org) to weigh in on these and other issues.

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How COVID-19 Fast-tracked Innovation in the Military Health System

The urgent demands of the COVID-19 pandemic forced the MHS to adjust quickly by building out new capabilities, implementing new customer-care techniques, and launching massive new research efforts.



The Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency announced four burial updates and one new identification for service members who have been missing and unaccounted-for from World War II and Korea:

Navy Fireman 1st Class Kenneth E. Doernenburg, 23, of Antigo, Wisconsin, was assigned to the battleship USS Oklahoma, which was moored at Ford Island, Pearl Harbor, when the ship was attacked by Japanese aircraft on Dec. 7, 1941. The USS Oklahoma sustained multiple torpedo hits, which caused it to quickly capsize. The attack on the ship resulted in the deaths of 429 crewmen, including Doernenburg. He will be buried on Sept. 25, 2021, in his hometown. Read about Doernenburg.

Navy Radioman 3rd Class Irvin F. Rice, 22, of Detroit, was assigned to the battleship USS Oklahoma, which was moored at Ford Island, Pearl Harbor, when the ship was attacked by Japanese aircraft on Dec. 7, 1941. The USS Oklahoma sustained multiple torpedo hits, which caused it to quickly capsize. The attack on the ship resulted in the deaths of 429 crewmen, including Rice. He will be buried on Oct. 2, 2021. Read about Rice.

Army Tech. Sgt. Arthur W. Countryman, 37, of Plainfield, Illinois, was assigned to Company F, 12th Infantry Regiment, 4th Infantry Division. His unit was engaged in battle with German forces near Hürtgen, Germany, when he was reported killed in action on Nov. 20, 1944. His body was not recovered. He will be buried on Aug. 6, 2021, in his hometown. Read about Countryman.

Army 1st Lt. Thomas J. Redgate, 24, of Brighton, Massachusetts, was a member of Battery A, 48th Field Artillery

Battalion, 7th Infantry Division. He was reported missing in action on Dec. 11, 1950, when his unit was attacked by enemy forces near the Chosin Reservoir, North Korea. Following the battle, his remains could not be recovered. He will be buried on Sept. 17, 2021, in Bourne, Massachusetts. Read about Redgate.

Navy Seaman 2nd Class Harold W. Lindsey, 26, was assigned to the battleship USS Oklahoma, which was moored at Ford Island, Pearl Harbor, when the ship was attacked by Japanese aircraft on Dec. 7, 1941. The USS Oklahoma sustained multiple torpedo hits, which caused it to quickly capsize. The attack on the ship resulted in the deaths of 429 crewmen, including Lindsey. Interment services are pending. Read about Lindsey.





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
