Combat-Related Special Compensation

You may be entitled to Combat-Related Special Compensation (CRSC) for your service-connected Diabetes mellitus type II. CRSC provides monthly payments to eligible retired Veterans with combat-related disability(ies), and is a benefit administered by the Department of Defense. Please note that entitlement to CRSC is not automatic. Accordingly, to receive CRSC for your service connected Diabetes mellitus type II, you must specifically apply for CRSC for that disability, even if you have already been awarded CRSC for disabilities previously service connected by VA. For information on applying for CRSC, contact your branch of service as shown below.
