Benefits for health effects of Agent Orange exposure

Veterans who were exposed to Agent Orange or other herbicides during service may be eligible for a variety of VA benefits, including an [Agent Orange Registry health exam](#), health care, and disability compensation for diseases associated with exposure.

Their dependents and survivors also may be eligible for benefits.
