" Because of continuing opposition to aerial spray missions by Vietnamese Provincial Health Authorities (unintentional use of herbicide-contaminated spray equipment by AF several years ago resulted in crop damage), there are no missions being flown in the Delta. Consequently 12 55 gal drums of 95% Malathion are being returned to Long Binh.
